Chairman Paul Anderson Called the Meeting to Order at 7:02 p.m.

PRESENT: Commissioners Bloetscher; Zelasko and Jurecki; Chief Warnick; Deputy Chief Hardin; Lt. Pelland; Sgt. Carmack; Detective Darzniek and Officer Counts. Commissioner Longton could not attend.

Jurecki moved, seconded by Zelasko to Accept the Additions to the Meeting.

2). Minutes:

Zelasko moved, seconded by Jurecki to Approve the Minutes of the Regular Police Commission Meeting of April 9, 2019. All in Favor.

3). Monthly Report:

Chief Warnick went over the reports reference tickets, etc. and answered any questions the Commission might have reference the reports. Chief Warnick highlighted on the following:

- Increase in Drunk Drivers/highest in 27 years.
- K9 Jury will demonstrate at the Open House.
- Discussed Juvenile Report.

4). Liaison Report:

Commissioner Bloetscher attended the Township Board Meeting on May 13, 2019, and the following were discussed:

1. August 6, 2019, the Police Millage Renewal will be on the ballot - 1.0 mils for 5 years (2019-2023). The Fire Dept. will also be on this ballot - 1.50 mils for 5 years (2019-2023).
2. Airport Manager Duker, DPW Manager Keim and Township Manager Reaume discussed and have agreed to put a pod type storage unit behind the DPS building on Groh Road for the Deer Cull Program. Insurance issues are still

being discussed but they do not think it will be a problem for the next deer cull season.

Chief Murdock was at the May 13th, Township Board Meeting and discussed plans to build a six-unit garage behind the Public Safety Building where the carports are currently located. The carports will be added in the same area around the building. The police department will own 25% of the building for their use. The building will not have water or heat. This will cost the police department approximately \$65,000.00 which will be paid with forfeiture funds.

5). Reserve Report:

Officer Carmack reported that the Cadet's have finished five days of training and they are currently working on dispatch hours and then will proceed to road hours. All uniforms have been ordered. The reserves worked 66.5 hours in April. They will help with the Police Department Open House on Thursday, May 16th. Lots of events coming up such as a run, high school graduation, swat scenario and the Islandfest. Woodhaven will be helping out at the Islandfest and our reserves will be helping them with the Sam Jam. Discussion held reference the Islandfest fireworks, it was mentioned that sponsorship is down.

Discussed Islandfest, soccer tournament, security, etc. We will have a command center at the Islandfest once again that we borrowing for the weekend from Homeland Security.

6). Deer/Coyote Update:

Deputy Chief Hardin put together a GIPD 2019 Coyote Management Plan. This was given to each Commissioner. DC Hardin went over the plan and highlighted on various points. Discussion held. The main thing is to assess and take appropriate action. We will get these out to the rotary, post and place some in the township hall. We will also run off for the open house.

7). Marijuana Impairment:

At the May 13th, Township Board Meeting passed an ordinance to prohibit recreational marijuana establishments within the boundaries of Grosse Ile Township.

8). Driver Awareness Overview:

Lt. Pelland attended the Distracted Driver Awareness Program (DDAP) on April 15th, which was held at Grosse Ile High School for the Juniors and Seniors. This was a two-segment program held in the auditorium and in the high school parking lot. There was an officer from Ferndale, Michigan who was the key speaker. The training included:

- simulated distracted driving techniques students rode golf carts while wearing impaired vision goggles
- life flight responded to a simulated fatal crash scene.

The program was very well done with much positive impact. The Office of Highway Safety funded the program.

9). Open House:

Getting ready for the open house which will be held on Thursday evening, May 16, 2019, from 5:00 p.m. until 7:00 p.m. Thank you to Lt. Pelland and Officer Carrico for getting everything together to make the program a success and to everyone for their hard work.

10). Vaping Ordinance:

Discussion held reference the need for a vaping ordinance and addressing in the future with the principals and the school board members. Farmington has an ordinance currently which addresses this and prohibits the use on school property and grounds.
